





Viva projects are almost like relationships, there's excitement followed by curiosity and interest.


But in most cases we get lost during the enlightenment phase.



Start small
Test, probe
Evolve or move forward
Ask Microsoft for help Microsoft

- How to calculate ROI?

Start with free versions
Start with PoC
Calculate ROI based on shared report
Differ access between users
Consider a Viva Suite license
Ask for discount






Viva is too difficult to deploy

Ask Microsoft for help (FastTrack RFA)







Nobody cares about Viva

Nobody cares about Viva


Create business case





Plan for You to start with Viva
